

Plastic process technician

Description

Plastic process technicians carry out the tasks within the production and processing of plastic items. They carry out these tasks based on work orders and work instructions. In order to ensure the required shape and colour of a plastic item, plastic process technicians carry out pressing, painting, rolling, and thermal processing. They operate the machines and devices which are used in the production of plastic goods. They also carry out product quality control so as to ensure that every product is of optimum quality. Besides, they are in charge of simple maintenance tasks. There is a great versatility of plastic products; they are used in mechanics, electronics, packaging industry, to make sport equipment, etc. Plastic process technicians make different plastic items, such as toys, tubes, domestic appliances, foils, plastic packaging, etc. In course of their work, plastic process technicians observe OHS measures and wear PPE. If they are involved in plastic processing at high temperature levels, they need to comply with all relevant regulations and guidelines.

In addition to possessing relevant knowledge – such as about plastic characteristics and processing methods, machines used in the production and processing of plastic products – in order to be able to do the plastic process technician's job, you need to be precise, well-organised, and have good spatial orientation. For a large part of activities within this job, teamwork is required.
